• Pupil Questionnaire

-Feedback from Pupil questionnaire was very positive with all children safe, happy, clear on learning and targets. They enjoyed clubs and suggested some other options including a Maths club and home work club!

The areas they wanted to see improve were around behaviour and manners at lunch time. We have discussed these in assembly and will now look at creating a lunchtime carter based on the children's ideas. This will then be displayed in the hall and referred to during lunchtimes.

• Reading dog

- The reading dog has been immensely successful in school and really had a positive impact on many children in more ways than reading alone. Unfortunately due to new health and safety concerns the dog has not been at school recently and the children have really missed Elsie. After careful consideration we have asked elsie to return and have asked parents to sign permission slips for this.

Clubs

-The children are happy with the range of clubs available which is not necessarily in line with the parent questionnaire. Some parents believe clubs should be free and /or run by staff. I will not ask staff to run clubs at the end of a full day. The choice and cost of clubs is, I believe, very reasonable. I had no response from the request of parent run clubs.

• Trips

- -The Victorian trip was very nearly cancelled as there was a big shortfall in payments received and the cost of the trip. More monies came in at the very last minute meaning it could go ahead. The children really enjoyed their day and it would have been a shame to have cancelled but school does not have the capacity to cover these costs.
