### Message from Sharon Staddon

**Dear Families,**

Where did that month go? It's hard to believe October is here so quickly. It's definitely time for the Harvest Samba again!

We have been very busy in September in school, as always.

We are now starting to see the impact of the new Phonics Programme and Talk for Writing. I love when the children come to share their written work. They are clearly very proud of what they have achieved and rightly so.

Please could we ask that you do not take any books home.

**Top tips** I have been asked to include top tips on managing children's emotional states and behaviours, where I can, which is why I have been adding these. I hope you are finding them helpful and useful reminders of things we all forget from time to time.

Being positive about school and showing respect for staff in front of your children goes a long way to teaching them to respect others and will help them to be successful in school.

Seemingly small things, like calling staff by the first names in front of the children, make a big difference. Likewise, in front of the children there should only be positive comments about school.

Using the First.... Then... statements can help to resolve conflict and ensure that they do as you need them to. For example, if a child has asked to go to the park but you need them to tidy their room using **First** tidy your room **Then** we will go to the park can make life a lot easier! If you are not already using this approach then give it a go but stick to it. I'd love to hear how it works or doesn't work for you.

Vik Verma (Director of Education and Learning) sent through some information which I think you may be interested in.

We all have a sensory profile which can change throughout the day depending on the environment around us. For some children, these sensory differences can have an impact on their day to day functioning, and interrupt the ability to attend to their learning. They may present as children with behaviours which challenge.

We've provided links below to a couple of leaflets giving a brief overview of what is meant by sensory difference. They suggest some sensory motor strategies to support children and young people to reach a 'just right' state for learning. These are available as attachments to this letter.

Since 2019, we have worked hard on thinking about changes we wanted to make regarding the children's learning. It took a long time to formulate our thinking but we believe we are in a place now where we can articulate those clearly and seek your views and ideas. Parent Forum members were the first to learn about our manners, politeness and life skills approach that is now starting to come to fruition in a more robust way. I hope that as many of you as possible can join us on 7th October. I am hoping that after the meeting we will be able to pull many different threads together and we can form a plan that we can share. We will ensure parents who can't attend the meeting have the opportunity to add their thoughts in the days following the meeting in the Reception area.
