<u>Paperball</u>

EYFS Area: Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Learning Goal: Managing feelings and behaviour

Did you know?

Research shows that determination is the most important ingredient in doing well at school.

How to play

- 1. Find some scrap paper and a bin. Scrunch up the paper into balls with your child.
- 2. Explain that your child needs to wait until you say 'ready, steady, go!' before they try to throw the ball into the bin.
- 3. **Encourage** your child to keep trying, but make sure they wait for your command before taking a shot.
- 4. When your child has thrown all the balls, ask them to help collect them all and put them back in the bin to tidy up.

TIP: Help your child follow the rules by keeping the balls out of sight and only offering one at a time.

Level 2

Encourage your child to take a few steps back so they are **further away** from the bin, and then throw the paperballs in - but only when you say 'ready, steady go!'

Level 3

When your child can get the paperball in the bin, stand up and pick the bin up, holding it at knee-height. Now, ask your child to throw the paperball in the bin again. Move the bin so it gets higher and higher and the challenge gets more difficult!

Top tip

To make the game more challenging, you can move the bin further away or even higher up, so it's a new target!
