A reminder that all children need to have a **named water bottle** in school. This enables them to access reasonable quantities of water in a hygienic way and also teaches them about keeping hydrated and about looking after their personal property.

As you are aware we have been working on removing and replacing the **play equipment** outside. Thanks to the support of a group of parents, this appears to be coming to fruition and I feel we are much closer to getting it done. Thank you to all of those who have been, and those who are still actively involved in this. Watch this space.

Staff attended the second part of **Gary Wilson's training** to learn some practical ways to support boys in our classrooms and at home. Having listened to Gary speak and reading I have done, it seems to me that the greatest gift we can give to boys is that of independence. We need to speak to boys the way we do to girls and have the same expectations of them. Apparently, we don't!

Due to a larger class we have added a second **Christmas Performance in Raccoons**. This will be on Thursday 19th December at 9.30. This is to accommodate the larger parent numbers and number restrictions in the hall. Parents will only be able to attend one performance and as usual there will be two tickets per family, in the first instance. It's Getting Darker! Be safe, Be seen!

When out and about during these dull days and as the months get darker. It's important to be seen by drivers as human eyesight struggles when we are in changing light conditions especially as it darkens. Wear something fluorescent, or reflective that breaks your body shape, that means you are 3 times more likely to stand out against the dark environment than just wearing white. Fluorescent material is effective outside during the daytime as it reacts the ultra-violet light. Reflective material works in the dark as it has a special surface to reflect lights such as street lighting or vehicle headlights. A combined approach by all road users for greater awareness of each other would reduce risk on our roads. Drivers to use dipped headlights to light the way ahead will be reflected if vulnerable road users are using hi-viz and reflective items or garments. Being a road aware community can save lives and is a great safety lesson for children and young adults.
