There have been some great examples of wonderful walking, legendary lining up and tremendous transitions too.





As promised, I have added some data from the year 2018-19 from our internal data tracking and also comparisons to national data , where they are available.




In the attainment chart, green and blue are age related expectations and above respectively, and red is below expectations.

There have been some significant changes in Education both nationally and for us at Milborne First School and I would like to share some of these with you. **OE afternoon and Fit Friday** The children are increasingly coming into school already dressed for both these activities. ## Key information

- **OPEN Morning** We will be holding another Open Morning on Friday 8th November, starting at 9:15 till 10:30am. Please let friends and family know who might wish to send their child to Milborne in September 2020.
- **SWIMMING YEAR 3** will be swimming after half term starting on Monday, 11th November until the 9th December. Please could parents let Miss Wittman know as soon as possible their child's level of swimming and if they are currently having lessons (where, when and what level they are currently on) or if they have never swam before. As this is the first time the Year 3s will be swimming with school we need swimming helpers, at least 3 parents who are willing to be in the water assisting Miss Wittman and any children who might need support. If there are parents who cannot commit to every week, Miss Wittman is happy to set up a rota with dates that you can do. If we do not have enough helpers in the pool then unfortunately the swimming session will have to be cancelled. We meet at the Milton Abbey pool at 1:30 and finish at 2:30. If transport is difficult there is the possibility of travelling with us on minibus to and from school but please let Miss Wittman know.
- **COOKING CLUB** (Year 2 Year 4 only) Mrs Dutton will be trialing a cooking club next term on a Tuesday after school, 3pm until 5pm. This will be starting on 5th November for 7 weeks. Please book in and pay via Libacura. There will be limited spaces, so please ensure that you have booked and paid by next Friday so ingredients can be bought for the first session and this will guarantee your child's space in cooking club. If your child is attending Cooking Club but you still need Afterschool care until 5:30pm then please book the 3-5:30 option in the Cooking Club section.

The usual afterschool clubs are also still available eg 3-4pm and 3-5:30pm. Please book as normal via Libacura. Thank you.
