Dear Parents and Children,


It's hard to believe that we are already at the end of our first half-term.

Trees for Dorset continue to come and work with us regularly. They support every year group from year 1 onwards and teach children how to recognise the seeds, nuts and berries of trees in our environment. Lots of these seeds are planted in pots in the hope of growing new trees. This is followed by bud identification in year 2 and the saplings from the previous year are planted into the tree nursery. In year 3 children investigate how leaves decompose and set up a wormery to observe and check on the growth of their trees. Finally, in year 4, the trees are planted out in the community (many have been planted in the local park) and the children visit the Bluebell Woods, to study an ancient woodland and admire the masses of beautiful bluebells!
