Message from Sharon Hunt!

Dear Parents.

You may have heard on the news that schools could take **Friday 18th December as an INSET day**. This was announced on Tuesday. This time would have needed to be made up, thus affecting the term dates already set. Therefore, as a trust we believe that this is too short notice to give to you, so we have decided **not** to take it. Children will therefore be in school on Friday as planned.

Contact tracing:

Coronavirus contact tracing during the Christmas break

As the Christmas break approaches, I would like to extend my thanks to all of our parents and carers for their positive support of our schools during this autumn term. It really has been a difficult term and I am enormously grateful to each of my colleagues for their positive outlook and commitment during this time.

The Department for Education has had to place some requirements on schools to continue with 'contract tracing' if it becomes necessary during the Christmas break. It is therefore important that all parents are aware of the following:

- If a child tests positive for coronavirus having developed symptoms <u>more than</u> 48 hours since being in school (that's from 21st December onwards), it is <u>not</u> necessary to contact the school. Instead, parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- For the first 6 days after school ends (that's up until 24th December), if a child tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms <u>within 48 hours</u> of being in school (during 19th or 20th of December), parents and carers should contact the school. The school will then assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation as the child may have been infectious whilst in school.
- From 25th December onwards, schools have no role to play in contact tracing for the remainder of the holiday and therefore should not be contacted.

If you do need to contact the school between 19th and 24th December to notify them of a positive test case, or if they need to contact you to advise self-isolation, then this is how that will happen:

- Parents should tell us about a child's positive test by emailing the school at s.hunt@milborne.dorset.sch.uk
- This email address will be checked once a day at 11am
- We will advise any families of the need to self-isolate via a text message which will read: 'We have heard that your child is a close contact of a positive test case. Your child is therefore required to self-isolate until [date]'.

This is not a message anyone wants to send or receive and I am sorry that you will receive it by text but I also need to minimise staff working during their holiday periods.

Where children are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first six days of the Christmas break (ie after the 24th December), you do not need to let school know until the first day back at school in January.

Food over Christmas:

Arrangements have now been put into place for food vouchers over the Christmas period. If you are eligible you will receive an email informing you of the details. These are being sent on the 16th December, therefore please also double check your 'junk mail', 'spam email' inboxes.

If your circumstances have recently changed or you think you need this support then please contact the school office to discuss as soon as possible. Your circumstances will be kept strictly confidential.
