It has been lovely to catch up with your children again and hear about the exciting things that you have done over the summer. They have come back to school with everything they need ready to learn and they look very smart in their uniforms. I know this takes a lot of time, money and effort and am pleased to see lots of named items too, so we can return them if they go missing. Thank you for making his happen.

A quick reminder of our **new class names - Reception** are **Respectful Rabbits**, Year 1/2 are **Responsible Robins** and Year 3/4 are **Resilient Racoons**.

Reception will enter and leave the school as they have done this year through the gate outside the main reception/office area. Year 1/2 will use Dolphins classroom and Year 3/4 will be in Puffins classroom.

In July I wrote about reviewing the curriculum. On INSET in September we have started to do this to ensure that we have a broad, balanced curriculum that reflects our values and what we believe to be important for children to learn. As this develops I will share with you. I will be asking for your comments and views.

Part of what we wanted to cover in the revised curriculum was to explicitly look at presentation and a pride in themselves and their school. You may have noticed that the children have been encouraged to shake staff's hands on entry whether that be in breakfast club, at the gate or on entry to the classroom. We think this is an important life skill and a positive way to come into school and feel valued for your child.

You will know from my July newsletter that one of the changes that we have already identified is that we would like to plan trips and /or visits at the start of the topic rather than the end so that children (and you) will be aware of the vocabulary we wish to learn during the topic and you can support your children at home as poor vocabulary and lack of exposure to experiences hinders the children's learning and their ability to link to new learning. We are working on creating a whole school bank of vocabulary covering Maths, Science topics and general vocabulary showing progression across the year groups. I will send this home for you to use as a reference point as soon as it is ready.

GTAT leaders have been working together to look at literacy and spelling across all the schools and there is a recurring theme around boys' spelling, writing and engagement to write. You will see below that Gary Wilson, an expert in this area will be leading staff across the schools to find out more and you are invited to what promises to be a very informative workshop. If you have boys -don't miss it, Even if you don't have boys this will be interesting as the strategies still apply to girls.
