








Maths and Literacy











This term in maths we have been learning about place value of tens and ones and identifying number patterns. What else has been going on in school?

Whales come to Milborne!

If you peeped through the door into the hall on Thursday 10^{th} January, you would have been surprised to see a dolphin and porpoise relaxing on the floor. I know all of the pupils were very surprised when they were invited in to whale workshops throughout the day... luckily the two cetaceans were life size plastic

models!





The workshops were led by Anna from Orca (a group that work to protect whales and dolphins and their environments.) We all learnt a lot of interesting facts about these beautiful and varied creatures. Children were able to handle and investigate the model jaws and found out a lot about the teeth and feeding habits of the many different species.

Year 2s were most impressed by the fact that a blue whale would be the same length as all 22 pupils and 2 adults lying head to toe! (33m.) We fitted around 3 sides of the hall!

We found out about the dangers that whales and dolphins face from mankind. Oil spills, noise pollution, over fishing and pollution. Over 80% of the letter in the ocean is plastic, that does not break down.



Children were so concerned about this that they immediately (and independently) organised a playtime litter club to collect any litter at school before it could be blown or washed into the stream. How wonderful to see such commitment to a cause that they took action in whatever way they could immediately.

Seahorses Class

Seahorses read the book 'Stick Man' by Miss Wittman's favourite author, Julia Donaldson. This gave us an idea.... We went on a walk around the school grounds to find a stick friend before heading into the wildlife area. We used string to create hair, by tying knots. What a tricky task but we persevered and created our own paintbrush. Next step mud painting!



Turtles Class

Turtles have been working really hard in literacy and writing some 2A sentences. (Sentences using two adjectives). Here are some examples:

'Emma turned into a brave, caring superhero!' By Darcie
'My beautiful, quiet cat has escaped.' By Martha 5
'They found a sparkling, glistening gem.' By Jemima.
'By midnight, she was a brave, intelligent superhero!' By Reuben.
